# Commissioners' Board Meeting Minutes April 6, 2017

The Berks County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Thursday, April 6, 2017, at 10:00 A.M. in the Boardroom on the 13th floor of the Berks County Services Center, pursuant to due notice to Board members and the public.

Commissioner Chair Christian Y. Leinbach called the meeting to order with Commissioner Kevin S. Barnhardt and Commissioner Mark C. Scott in attendance. Also present were County Solicitor Christine M. Sadler, Chief Administrative Officer Ronald R. Seaman and Chief Clerk Maryjo Gibson.

Commissioner Leinbach opened the meeting with a moment of silence and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

#### **Presentation**

Dr. Anna Weitz, President of Reading Area Community College ("RACC"), and Dr. Susan Looney, Senior Vice President of Academic Affairs/Provost at RACC, presented information on the new off-site satellite location at Wilson Southern Middle School. Dr. Weitz reported that the new location is an all-purpose, easily accessible site and offers ample free parking. RACC will be entering into an all-inclusive one (1) year lease with the Wilson School District, with an option to renew if the location is successful.

Dr. Looney reported there will be over 40 sections offered Monday through Thursday, from 4:30 8:45 p.m., and is open to everybody, not just residents of the Wilson School District.

Commissioner Leinbach thanked Dr. Weitz for an excellent job of keeping the Board informed, and this is a great opportunity for more people to take advantage of RACC's educational offerings.

COO to a CAO we wanted to simply clarify whatever duties were previously designated to the COO to the CAO.

# **REPORT OF CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER**

Kim Grinage, Deputy Director of Budget and Finance, reported at today's Budget Meeting there will be a Cash Flow Update, a 911 Phone System Response discussion and a Berks County Bridge Funding Strategy discussion.

#### REPORT OF CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER

Ronald R. Seaman expressed gratitude to the Board for their support in accepting the proposal of Berry, Dunn, McNeil & Parker on the Assessment Consulting and Management Upgrade project, and thanked the Assessment Office staff, Recorder of Deeds Fred Sheeler and Treasurer Dennis Adams for their continued input in making the project a success.

#### **COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS**

#### Commissioner Barnhardt

Commissioner Barnhardt announced tomorrow morning at 10:00 a.m. the Buttonwood Street Bridge will officially be reopened to vehicular traffic.

Commissioner Barnhardt announced Tuesday, April 11, 2017 at the DoubleTree Hotel at either 8 a.m. or 5 p.m. there will be outreach meetings for folks impacted by changes due to the Penn Street Bridge construction, advising PennDOT representatives will attend the 8:00 a.m. session to answer any questions.

Commissioners Barnhardt reported there will be additional meetings spearheaded by Brian Gottschall, Director of Berks County Emergency Management, with local police agencies from the impacted communities along the By-Pass and the closure of Ramp K due to the Penn Street Bridge construction, to come up with alternative plans in the event of accidents or emergencies.

Commissioner Barnhardt attended yesterday's Naturalization Ceremony for Karen Barsoum, a County employee in Election Services, and commended Sandy Graffius, who was one of the singers of the Sweet Adaline's.

### **Commissioner Scott**

Commissioner Scott commended the Reading Eagle and Reporter Nicole Brambila for the update to the report on the status of the lead pollution problem in Laureldale surrounding the Exide Plant. Commissioner Scott commented this issue has been subject to litigation by Berks County, who has been at the forefront in efforts to assure the public health of residents of that area. Commissioner Scott recognized the collaboration of a study by the Reading Eagle and Metropolitan State University of more testing at various sites in the area that have determined a significant number of locations above remediation levels.

## Commissioner Leinbach

Commissioner Leinbach reported earlier this week he attended a Town Hall Meeting at the Agricultural Center hosted by the Lebanon Veterans Affairs Medical Center in conjunction with Berks County Veterans Affairs Office. It was a very informative and impressive formal presentation and had key staff members from the Lebanon Medical Center, including a surgeon in charge of medical operations, and experts for Veterans health benefits. Commissioner Leinbach thanked Dale Derr and his team for putting on the event.

Commissioner Leinbach reported a major announcement this morning will be made that the Velodrome is going to become a reality. Albright College is partnering with World Cycling League to construct an indoor cycling center and will be built on land owned by Albright Collect.

Commissioner Leinbach expects very soon there will be an announcement on Reading 120, and he believes that the event is going to go forward.

#### **COMMENTS FROM THE FLOOR**

County Controller Graffius thanked Commissioner Barnhardt for remarking on the Naturalization Ceremony yesterday and expressed how moving it was to see the audiences' reactions to her group singing patriotic songs.
