## What is Geocaching?

Geocaching is a real-world, outdoor treasure hunting game. Participants navigate to a specific set of GPS coordinates using a GPS or smartphone and then attempt to find a geocache (container) hidden at that location. Geocaches can be as small as a dime or as large as an ammo can. Each cache is different, but most will hold trinkets and a log book. Record your visit and trade “swag” while remembering to **Cache In, Trash Out** by taking trash with you when you leave. How many caches will you find?

Collect the “keywords” at each TCV Geo-Trail cache, to answer the puzzle and assemble the phrase (see inside brochure).


