

## May 11<sup>th</sup> to the 18<sup>th</sup> week end report

During the week of May 11<sup>th</sup> to the 17<sup>th</sup> the fire company responded to 6 calls. The first call for service was dispatched on the 11<sup>th</sup> just before 10pm. Rescue 33, along with Engine and Rescue 32 (Walnuttown) and Rescue 46 (Kutztown) were sent to the 1800 block of Moselum Springs Rd. for an accident involving a motorcycle. Chief 33 arrived and found the scene as reported and established Richmond command. Rescue 33 arrived and assisted EMS with patient packaging, scene lighting and debris clean up. Command recalled Rescues 46 and 32. Station 33 Fire Police with the help of Engine 32 provided traffic direction around the scene while Police conducted their investigation and the towing company removed the vehicle from the scene. Station 33 had 11 Members respond.

The second call for the week was dispatched on May 12<sup>th</sup>. Tanker and Rescue 33 were dispatched to assist Station 46 (Kutztown) for an accident with injuries and fire on Interstate 78 at mile post 41.4. Tanker 33 went responding shortly after dispatch and was given orders to respond directly to the scene and supply Engine 46 and to provide manpower for the scene. Rescue 33 was ordered to standby at exit 40 and cover calls in the area. Both units were released within an hour. Station 33 had 9 Members respond.

Call number 3 for the week was also dispatched on May 12<sup>th</sup>, a short time after the previous assignment was released. This time Company 33 Fire Police were sent to Exit 35 on Interstate 78 to begin a re-route for traffic due to the accident at mile post 41.4. Fire Police responded with Brush 33 and set up and take traffic off the interstate at exit 35 east bound. Station 33 had 7 Members respond.

On May 13<sup>th</sup> Ladder 33 was dispatched to Windsor Township at the Hamburg Area Middle School to assist Station 61 (Hamburg) with a Gas Detector activation in the kitchen area. Upon arrival, Ladder 33 was requested by command to ladder the Alpha side of the building and investigate the roof in the area of the kitchen. Ladder 33 sent a crew of 3 to the roof with the TIC and gas meter. No issues were found and the assignment was placed available. Station 33 had 6 Members respond.

May 16<sup>th</sup> Rescue 33 and Engine 44 (Kempton) were dispatched to Greenwich Township Interstate 78 East Bound in the area of Mile Post 36.4 for an accident with unknown injuries. The Rescue went responding and was given the report of a vehicle spun out and hit the center divider. Upon checking the area and no accident being found, it was determined that the vehicle left the scene before the fire departments arrival and the assignment was recalled. Station 33 had 4 members respond.

The final call for the week was dispatched on May 16<sup>th</sup> in the afternoon. Engine 33 was due to respond assisting Station 44 (Kempton) with smoke from the trees North of Interstate 78 in the area of the Saddle Rd. overpass. Lt. 44 was in the area with nothing showing and held Engine 33 at station. Upon checking the area Lt. 44 reported nothing found and recalled the assignment a short time later. Station 33 had 3 members respond.
