Part 1**General Regulations****§15-101. Definitions and Interpretation.**

1. Words and phrases, when used in this Chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania, as now in force, or as hereafter amended, enacted or reenacted, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning.

2. In this Chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

3. The words “street” and/or “alley” shall include all public lanes of the Borough of Shillington.

§15-102. Manner of Adopting Permanent Traffic and Parking Regulations.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances or as parts of ordinances or as amendments to ordinances of the Borough of Shillington.

§15-103. Temporary and Emergency Regulations.

The Mayor shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:

A. In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations.

B. In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours. Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Mayor and the Police Department in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulations, or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected or posted or made to give notice of any such regulation, shall, upon summary conviction thereof, be liable to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter for a violation of such nature, and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter, to a fine or penalty of not more than \$50 and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment for not more than 10 days.

§15-104. Experimental Regulations.

The Borough Council may, from time to time, designate places upon and along the streets and alleys in the Borough where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specific

traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect, and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective just as if they had been specified in this Chapter. No person shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulations, prohibition or restriction, and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected or made by authority of this Section. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter for a violation of such nature, and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter to a fine of not more than \$10 and costs of prosecution.

Provided: the purpose of this Section is to allow for the test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the Borough relative to traffic and parking.

§15-105. Authority of Police Officers.

The police officers of the Borough are hereby given authority to direct traffic on the streets and alleys in the Borough, and at intersections thereof.

Part 2**Traffic Regulations****§15-201. Motor Vehicles Not to Be Driven on Sidewalks.**

No person shall operate any motor vehicle longitudinally upon any sidewalk in the Borough; nor shall any person operate any motor vehicle upon or across any sidewalk except in order to gain access to or egress from a driveway or alley at such locations where the curb, if such sidewalk is curbed, shall have been properly cut down for the purpose. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Section shall, upon summary conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$50 and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment for not more than 10 days.

§15-202. Speed Limits Established.

1. No person shall hereinafter operate a motor vehicle within the Borough of Shillington upon any street or portion thereof, which is owned and maintained by the Borough of Shillington, in excess of 25 miles per hour EXCEPT East Broad Street between Philadelphia Avenue and Kings Boulevard which shall be 15 miles per hour and Museum Road from Lancaster Avenue to the Wyomissing Borough line which shall be 35 miles per hour. 2. Any person, who shall operate a vehicle or tractor at a speed in excess of that established therefor upon any street or portion thereof specified in this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$35 and costs. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than 5 miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of \$2 per mile for each mile in excess of 5 miles per hour over the maximum speed limit. §15-203. Traffic Signals at Certain Intersections.

1. At the following intersections, official traffic signals shall be erected (or if heretofore erected are hereby ratified), and traffic at such intersections may be directed by those signals:

East Lancaster Avenue and Waverly Street
East Lancaster Avenue and Woodland Avenue
East and West Lancaster Avenue at Liberty Street and Philadelphia Avenue
West Lancaster Avenue and Miller Street
West Lancaster Avenue and Museum Road
West Lancaster Avenue and Sterley Street
West Lancaster Avenue and Wyomissing Avenue
South Wyomissing Avenue and West Broad Street

Philadelphia Avenue and Waverly Street, Spruce Street

§15-205. U-Turns Prohibited at Certain Intersections.

It shall be unlawful for the operator of any vehicle or tractor to make a U-turn anywhere upon any public street or alley in the Borough. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

§15-206. Left and/or Right Turns Prohibited at Certain Intersections.

1. It shall be unlawful for the operator of any vehicle or tractor, traveling upon the first-named street at any of the following intersections, in the direction or directions

hereby indicated in each case, to make a left turn and/or a right turn at the said intersection, as hereby indicated:

§15-207. Through Highways Established.

1. The following highways are hereby established as through highways, and the operator of every vehicle or tractor, upon approaching any such highway at any intersection thereof (except for such intersections where there are now or shall

hereafter be located official traffic signals) shall come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering any such through highway:

2. Every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop or yield sign authorized by this Section shall stop the vehicle or yield right-of-way as required by §§3323(b), 3323(c) of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. §§3323(b), 3323(c), as the case may be, and shall not proceed into or across the through highway until he has followed all applicable requirements of that section of the law. Any person who violates any provision of this Section, shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs. §15-208. Stop Intersections Established.

1. The following intersections (in addition to streets and alleys intersecting with the through highways established by §15-207 of this Part) are hereby established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected (or are hereby confirmed if heretofore erected) in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street upon the first-named street, in the direction or directions hereby indicated. All vehicles and tractors approaching any such intersection upon the first named streets, in the direction or directions hereby indicated in each case, shall come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering any such intersection:

Any operator of a vehicle or tractor who shall fail to come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering any stop intersection, as hereinabove required, shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs. §15-209. Certain Classes of Vehicles Prohibited on Certain Streets. [Ord. 1032]

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any vehicle or tractor, except than a passenger vehicle (but not including any passenger vehicle drawing any trailer or towing any other vehicle) upon any of the following portions of the streets and alleys in the Borough:

2. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Section shall, upon summary conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$50 and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment for not more than 10 days. **Provided:** nothing in this Section shall prohibit the operation of any commercial vehicle or tractor upon any street or alley or portion thereof listed herein, where such operation thereon shall be necessary in order to pick up or deliver any goods, wares, merchandise or material from or to any premises located upon such street or alley or portion thereof.

§15-210. Play Highways Authorized.

The Mayor is hereby authorized to designate as play highway, whenever he shall deem such action advisable, and for whatever period of time directed by him, any portion of any street or alley in the Borough, whereon sledding and coasting shall be permitted. Such highway shall be set apart for the purpose under the direction of the Mayor. No person shall operate any motor vehicle or tractor upon any play highway at any time when such highway shall be designated, except in case of emergency, with

special permission of the Mayor or of the police officer in charge, who shall first clear such highway of all persons using such highway for the purpose for which it was set aside. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

Part 3

General Parking Regulations

§15-301. Parking Without Lights Authorized.

The boundary limits of the Borough of Shillington are hereby established as a zone in which motor vehicles may remain standing without lights, and all streets and alleys within such boundary limits are hereby designated as streets and alleys where motor vehicles may remain standing without lights.

§15-302. Vehicles to be Parked Within Marked Spaces.

Wherever a space is marked off on any street or alley for the parking of an individual vehicle, every vehicle there parked shall be parked wholly within the lines bounding such space.

§15-306. Parking Prohibited Between 2 A.M. and 6 A.M.

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to park, or allow to remain parked, on any street or public alley or any part of any street or public alley in residential and institutional zones within the Borough of Shillington, any vehicle other than a passenger vehicle or car. The definition of a passenger vehicle or car does not include buses, tow trucks, roll-back trucks, stake body trucks, step vans, cube vans, any truck in excess of 10,000 pounds (GVW), and moving vans, except for local pick-up and delivery.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to park, or allow to remain parked, on any street or public alley or any part of any street or public alley in residential and institutional zones within the Borough of Shillington for more than 24 hours the following: boats, motor homes, camping trailers, trailers of any type or passenger cars attached to trailers of any kind.

3. It shall be unlawful for any person to park, or allow to remain parked, on any street or public alley or any part of any street or public alley in residential and institutional zones within the Borough of Shillington, any construction vehicles unless a building or work permit been obtained from the Town Hall relative thereto.

Part 4**Removal and Impoundment of Illegally Parked Vehicles****§15-401. Authority to Remove and Impound Illegally Parked Vehicles.**

The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to remove and impound, or to order the removal and impounding, of any vehicle parked on any of the streets, highways or public property of the Borough in violation of any of the provisions of the law or of any ordinance of the Borough. **Provided:** no vehicle shall be removed or impounded except in strict accordance with the provisions of this Part.

§15-403. Garage to Post Bond.

Every such approved storage garage shall post a bond, in the amount of \$3,000 to be filed with the Borough Secretary, for the indemnifying of the owner of any such impounded vehicle against the loss thereof, or injury or damage thereto, while in custody of said poundkeeper.

§15-404. Towing and Storage Charges Fixed.

The following are hereby fixed and established as the charges that shall be made for the towing and storage of any vehicle removed and impounded under the authority of this Part.

Reasonable towing charges of a reputable service station

Plus - Storage - \$1.00 per diem.

Plus - 25% overhead charges.

§15-405. Chief of Police to Notify Owners of Impounded Vehicles.

Within 12 hours from the time of removal of any vehicle under authority granted by this Part, notice of the fact that such vehicle has been impounded shall be sent by the Chief of Police of the Borough, to the owner of record of such vehicle. Such notice shall designate the place from which said vehicle was removed, the reason for its removal and impounding, and the pound in which it shall have been impounded.

§15-406. Effect of Payment of Towing and Impounding Charges Without Protest.

The payment of any towing and impounding charges authorized by this Part shall, unless such payment shall have been made "under protest," be final and conclusive, and shall constitute a waiver of any right to recover the money so paid.

§15-407. Effect of Payment of Charges Under Protest.

In the event that any towing and impounding charges, so imposed, shall be paid "under protest," the offender shall be entitled to a hearing before a magistrate or court of record having jurisdiction, in which case such defendant shall be proceeded against and shall receive such notice as is provided by the Vehicle Code in other cases of summary offenses, and shall have the same rights as to appeal and waiver of hearing.

§15-408. Records of Vehicles Removed and Impounded.

The Chief of Police shall keep a record of all vehicles impounded and shall be able at all reasonable times to furnish the owners or agents of the owners thereof with information as to the place of storage of such vehicles.

§15-409. Owner or Operator of Vehicle Remains Liable to Fine or Penalty.

The payment of towing and storage charges shall not operate to relieve the owner or operator of any vehicle from liability for any fine or penalty for the violation of any law or ordinance on account of which the said vehicle was removed and impounded.

§15-410. Restrictions upon Removal of Vehicles.

No vehicle shall be removed under the authority of this Part if, at the time of the intended removal thereof, the owner or person for the time being in charge of such vehicle is present and expresses a willingness and intention to remove such vehicle immediately.

Part 5**Snow Emergency Regulations****§15-501. Short Title.**

This Chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Snow Emergency Ordinance of the Borough of Shillington".

§15-502. Definitions.

In this Chapter, except as herein otherwise defined, the terms used shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code.

For the purpose of this Chapter, the following definitions shall prevail:

Mayor - Mayor of the Borough of Shillington.

Borough - the Borough of Shillington.

Chief of Police - the official in charge of all Police directives under the Mayor's jurisdiction.

Street or Highway - the entire width between curbs or boundary lines of every way publicly maintained when any part thereof is open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular travel.

Roadway - that portion of a street or highway improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular travel, exclusive of the berm or shoulder.

Snow emergency routes - those streets marked as such in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter.

Sidewalk - that portion of a street between the curb lines or the lateral lines of a roadway, and the adjacent property lines intended for the use of pedestrians.

Barricade - any object visible for a distance of 100 feet in clear weather that is used to block off an area of a street or highway.

Snow tires - any tires mounted on drive wheels of motor vehicles which are especially designed by tire manufacturers to give effective traction on snow, mud or ice covered streets by means of extra heavy duty treads with special high traction patterns, except that no tire so defined shall be construed to be a snow tire if it is worn to less than 3/16" tread depth or is damaged or worn to the extent that its performance would be substantially impaired.

Tire chains - any hard metal chains mounted on drive wheel tires of motor vehicles which cross the tread of each such tire laterally in at least eight different places.

Cinder - any abrasive material to be put on hard snow or ice areas, including, but not limited to, cinder, sand, fine gravel, saw dust, salt, or fine crushed stone.

Snow measurement - the average of three or more readings in any area established by the Mayor or the Chief of Police.

Business hours - the hours between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on any business day.

Business day - any day not a Sunday or Christmas, Thanksgiving or New Year but all other holidays shall be considered business days.

Person - include any natural person, firm, company, partnership, association or corporation.

Central business district - the area in the Borough of Shillington known as Lancaster Avenue between Museum Road and Summit Street.

§15-503. Parking on Snow Emergency Routes.

1. Whenever the Mayor finds, on the basis of falling snow, sleet or freezing rain, or on the basis of a forecast by the U. S. Weather Bureau or other weather service of snow, sleet or freezing rain, that weather conditions will make it necessary that motor vehicle traffic be expedited and that parking or standing on Borough streets be prohibited or restricted for snow plowing and other purposes, the Mayor shall put into effect a parking prohibition on parts of or all snow emergency routes as necessary by declaring it in a manner prescribed in this Chapter.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection .1 hereof, a parking prohibition shall automatically go into effect on any part of any snow emergency route on which there has been an accumulation of snow and ice of 6 inches or more.

3. Once in effect, a prohibition under this section shall remain in effect for 24 hours, except that any street area which has become substantially clear of snow and ice from curb to curb for the length of the entire block shall be automatically excluded therefrom. While the prohibition is in effect, no person shall park or allow to remain parked any vehicle on any portion of a snow emergency route to which it applies. However, nothing in this section shall be construed to permit parking at any time or place where it is forbidden by any other provision of law.

§15-504. Parking on Secondary Streets.

1. Whenever the Mayor finds, on the basis of falling snow, sleet, freezing rain, or on the basis of a forecast by the U. S. Weather Bureau or other weather service of snow, sleet, or freezing rain, that weather conditions will make it necessary that motor vehicle traffic be expedited and that parking on Borough streets be prohibited or restricted for snow plowing and other purposes, the Mayor shall put into effect a parking prohibition on parts of or all secondary streets as necessary by declaring it in a manner prescribed by this Chapter. The prohibition shall remain in effect until terminated by announcement of the Mayor in accordance with this Chapter, except that any street area which has become substantially clear of snow and ice from curb to median line for the length of the entire block shall be automatically excluded therefrom.

2. While the prohibition is in effect, no person shall park or allow to remain parked any vehicle on any street to which it applies, except as permitted below:

A. Vehicles may be parked on the uneven-street-numbers side of the street on days with names that have the letter "u" in their spelling, i.e., Sunday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday.

B. Vehicles may be parked on the even-street-numbers side of the street on

days with names that do not have the letter "u" in their spellings, i.e., Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.

3. Nothing in this section shall be construed to permit parking any time or place where it is forbidden by any other provision of law.

§15-505. Condition of Motor Vehicles Operated on Snow Emergency or Secondary Street Routes.

1. No person operating a motor vehicle on a snow emergency route on which there is a covering of snow, sleet or ice shall allow such vehicle to become stalled wholly or partly because the drive wheels thereof are not equipped with effective tire chains or snow tires.

2. No person operating a motor vehicle on a part of a snow emergency route on which there is a covering of snow, sleet or ice or on which there is a parking prohibition in effect shall allow such vehicle to become stalled because the motor fuel supply is exhausted or the battery has become inoperative.

3. No person shall operate a motor vehicle on a snow emergency route on which there is a covering of snow, sleet or ice if said vehicle does not have all windows clear of snow and ice.

4. No person shall operate a motorcycle, motor scooter, bicycle, other unlicensed vehicles or modes of transportation on a snow emergency route on which there is a covering of snow, sleet or ice.

§15-506. Removing and Impounding of Vehicles.

1. Members of the Police Department are hereby authorized to remove or have removed a vehicle from a street when:

A. The vehicle is parked on a part of a snow emergency route on which a parking prohibition is in effect.

B. The vehicle is stalled on a part of a snow emergency route on which there is a covering of snow, sleet or ice on which there is a parking prohibition in effect and the person does not appear to be removing it in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter.

C. The vehicle is parked in violation of any parking ordinance or provision of law and is interfering or about to interfere with snow removal operations.

2. Any Borough owned vehicle is authorized to push or otherwise remove, without liability on the Borough's part for any damage resulting thereto, any stalled vehicle remaining in violation of the foregoing provision.

§15-507. Declarations of the Mayor.

1. The Mayor shall cause each declaration made by him pursuant to this Chapter to be publicly announced by means of simultaneous broadcasts from all of radio stations WEEU, WIOV, WRAW and WRFY, or any other radio station with a normal operating

range covering the Borough. The Mayor may also cause such declaration to be further announced in newspapers of general circulation in the Borough when feasible. A parking prohibition or advancement of quitting-time traffic regulations declared by the Mayor shall not go into effect until at least 2 hours after it has been announced at least two times between 6 a.m. and 11 p.m., in accordance with this section.

2. The Mayor shall make or cause to be made a record of each time and date when any declaration is announced to the public in accordance with this section.

3. The Mayor and the Chief of Police are hereby jointly authorized to request all vehicles to bypass the Borough and not to enter the Borough if snow emergency conditions within the Borough make such a request advisable.

§15-508. Termination of Parking Prohibition by the Mayor.

Whenever the Mayor shall find that some or all of the conditions which give rise to a parking prohibition in effect pursuant to this Chapter no longer exist, he shall declare the prohibition terminated, in whole or part, in a manner prescribed by this Chapter, effective immediately upon announcement.

§15-509. Provisions Temporarily Effective to Take Precedence.

Any provision of this Chapter which becomes effective by declaration of the Mayor or upon the occurrence of certain weather conditions shall, while temporarily in effect, take precedence over other conflicting provisions of law normally in effect, except that it shall not take precedence over provisions of law relating to traffic accidents, emergency travel of authorized emergency vehicles, or emergency traffic directions by a police officer.

§15-510. Signs to Mark Snow Emergency or Secondary Routes; Barricades.

1. On each street designated by this Chapter as a snow emergency route, the Mayor shall post special signs, one in each block with the wording: "**SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTE, NO PARKING DURING EMERGENCY. TOW AWAY ZONE**" or such other wording as shall be approved by the Secretary of Highways of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. These signs shall be distinctive and uniform in appearance and shall be plainly readable to persons traveling on the street or highway.

2. The Mayor and Chief of Police are hereby jointly and severally authorized to barricade any street and redirect traffic whenever necessary to plow, clear or otherwise remove snow. It shall be unlawful for any person to bypass or run through or over any such barricade.

3. Borough controlled or operated equipment is permitted to operate in any direction on any street at any time upon orders of the Mayor.

§15-511. Citation on Vehicle Parked or Left in Violation of Ordinance.

Whenever any motor vehicle is found parked or left in violation of any provision of this Chapter, notice of such violation shall be given in the manner provided by the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code.

§15-512. Evidence with Respect to Vehicles Parked or Left in Violation of Chapter.

In any prosecution with regard to a vehicle parked or left in a place or in a condition in violation of any provision of this Chapter, proof that the particular vehicle described in the complaint was parked or left in violation of a provision of this Chapter, together with proof that the defendant named in the complaint was at the time the registered owner of such vehicle, shall constitute prima facies evidence that the defendant was the person who parked or left the vehicle in violation of this Chapter.

§15-513. Snow Emergency Routes Designated.

The following streets or highways or portions of streets or highways within the Borough are hereby designated as Snow Emergency Routes:

Broad Street (East and West) - Kings Boulevard to Museum Road
Brobst Street (North and South) - Museum Road to Waverly Street
Elm Street (East and West) - Museum Road to Wheatland Avenue
Gregg Street - Wheatland Avenue to Summit Street
Kerrick Road - South Miller Street to South Wyomissing Avenue [*Ord. 1069*]
Lancaster Avenue (East and West) - Museum Road to Borough Line
Liberty Street - Lancaster Avenue to Elm Street
New Holland Avenue - Lancaster Avenue to Borough Line
South Miller Street - Lancaster Avenue to Kerrick Road
North Miller Street - Lancaster Avenue to Elm Street
Philadelphia Avenue - Lancaster Avenue to Borough Line
Spruse Street - Philadelphia Avenue to Broad Street
South Wyomissing Avenue - Lancaster Avenue to Borough Line
North Wyomissing Avenue - Lancaster Avenue to Elm Street

§15-514. Removal and Impounding of Vehicles.

If any person parks or leaves a vehicle in a place or in a condition in violation of any provision of this Chapter, such vehicle may be removed by or under the direction of a police officer of the Borough by means of towing or otherwise, costs of which shall be assessed against the owner or operator of said vehicle.

§15-515. Penalties.

Every person convicted of a violation of any provision of this Chapter shall upon each such summary conviction before the District Justice, be sentenced to pay a fine not

less than \$25 and not more than \$300.00 and cost of prosecution for each offense. In default of payment of such fine and costs, said person shall undergo imprisonment not to exceed 15 days.

Part 6**Regulation of Non-Motorized Vehicles****§15-601. Short Title.**

This Chapter shall be known as the "Shillington Borough Skateboard Ordinance."

§15-602. Definitions.

Skateboard - a skateboard as used herein shall mean any wooden, metal or plastic board on one side of which is affixed two (2) or more wheels and which is used for coasting and is guided by the distribution of weight of the user.

Scooter - a scooter, and other similar non-motorized objects, as used herein shall mean any wooden, metal or plastic platform with wheels which is used for coasting or is propelled by the user thereof pushing the same with his foot or portions of his body.

§15-603. Skateboards, Scooters, and Other Similar Non-Motorized Objects Not to Be Operated on Public Streets.

1. Immediately upon the enactment of this Chapter, it shall be illegal for anyone to operate a skateboard or boards, scooters, or other similar non-motorized or motorized objects on the public streets, public alleys and public parks within the Borough of Shillington.

2. Additionally, it shall be illegal for anyone to operate a skateboard or boards, scooters, or other similar non-motorized or motorized objects on the public sidewalks in any Commercial, Limited Commercial or Institutional Zones within the Borough of Shillington, as set forth in the Borough of Shillington Zoning Ordinance [Chapter 27].

§15-604. Penalties.

Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this Chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$300, and/or to imprisonment for a term not to exceed 90 days.
