### NEW POLICE CHIEF WELCOME!

The Board of Supervisors is pleased to announce the appointment of Barry L. Whitmoyer to the position of Chief of Police. Chief Whitmoyer has deep roots in the community as well as a broad base of supervisory experience in law enforcement having retired from the Pennsylvania State Police in July 2016 after 25 years of service to the Commonwealth.

Born and raised in South Heidelberg Township, Chief Whitmoyer graduated from Conrad Weiser High School in 1983 and from West Chester University in 1987. He currently resides in Lower Heidelberg Township with his wife Fina, his children Timothy and Erika as well as his two dogs and one cat.

Chief Whitmoyer began his career with the State Police on patrol in Troop K, Philadelphia, later transferring to the Limerick/Skipack station where he was a Criminal Investigator for 7 years. In 1998, he transferred to the Reading Station and served as a Criminal Investigator for the next 6 years. After being promoted to the rank of Corporal, he worked in Harrisburg and Fogelsville for the Bureau of Integrity and Professional Standards for several years. A promotion to Sergeant and an assignment as Station Commander of the Frackville Station in Schuylkill County came next. After serving there for 4 years, Chief Whitmoyer transferred back to the Reading Station where he became the Troop Criminal Investigation Commander. He served in this capacity for several years achieving the rank of Lieutenant and receiving an assignment to the Department Discipline Office in Harrisburg. He retired from this position to accept the new position as Chief of the South Heidelberg Police Department.
