2	<b>ELECTRICAL SAFETY FOR EMERGENCY RESPONDERS</b>	This program provides the emergency responder with safety information when Responding to emergencies that involve electricity or where electricity may be present including Electric Hazards; ground gradient, step potential, touch potential, back feeding, cross-conduction, Ladder Operations, Electrical Distribution Systems, Rescue, and Electric Substations <b>Presented by PECO</b>	2 HOURS MORNING ONLY
3	<b>PRE-HOSPITAL RESPONSE TO RADIATION ACCIDENT PATIENTS MS-1</b>	This class will prepare EMS personnel to safely deal with radiation accident patients.
