

ORDINANCE NO. 321

An Ordinance prohibiting the discharge of any gun or other firearm, including but not limited to rifles, pistols, airguns, zipguns and spring loaded guns in the Borough of Kenhorst, prescribing penalty for violation and repealing a prior ordinance.

The Borough of Kenhorst hereby ordains as follows:

Section 1. Discharge of Firearms Prohibited. Except in necessary defense of person or property, it shall be unlawful, within the Borough of Kenhorst, for any person to use, fire or discharge and gun or other firearm, including but not limited to rifles, pistols, airguns, zipguns and spring loaded guns. Provided: this shall not apply where the firearm is lawfully used in hunting as provided for by the Pennsylvania Game Commission, by the rules and regulations of the Pennsylvania Game Commission.

Section 2. Penalty for Prohibited Use of Firearms. Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall, upon summary conviction thereof before a District magistrate, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment in the Berks County Prison for not more than thirty (30) days.

Section 3. Ordinance 303, Prohibiting the discharge of any gun or other firearm, including but not limited to rifles, pistols, airguns, zipguns and spring loaded guns, except in necessary defense of person or property, within the Borough of Kenhorst, and prescribing penalty for violation, approved April 5, 1973, is hereby repealed.
