Sheriff finds solace in overwhelming and broad support

In the wake of the fatal shooting of Berks County Deputy Sheriff Kyle D. Pagerly, Sheriff Eric J. Weaknecht said he took some solace in the outpouring of support from law enforcement and government officials, local businesses and the community.

Pagerly was fatally shot June 29 while working with a fugitive task force trying to serve a warrant on a suspect in

Weaknecht said the response to the tragedy was almost

"I got a call from Philadelphia police Commissioner Charles H. Ramsey," Weaknecht said as he stood in the blazing sun Wednesday in his dress uniform waiting Pagerly's memorial service in the Sovereign Center

Ramsey told the sheriff he was dispatching his contingent of officers responsible for organizing and officiating at memorial services for slain police officers.

"He told me, 'Unfortunately we get to do this too much,' " Weaknecht said.

Lancaster deputy sheriffs worked a night shift Tuesday, learning the ropes in the 24-hour, seven-day-a-week Berks Central Processing Center so they could relieve their colleagues during Wednesday's memorial service, Weaknecht said. Suspects brought in Wednesday were taken to the holding cells, where Reading police watched them until the Berks deputies returned to work Wednesday night.

"This is our first," he said. "And, God willing, our last."
