

ORDINANCE NO. 91

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER BERN, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, RESTRICTING THE PARKING OF CERTAIN VEHICLES ON TOWNSHIP ROADWAYS.

BE IN ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the authority of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Upper Bern, Berks County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the authority of the same as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to park recreational vehicles on any street, alley or cartway in the Township for a period exceeding two (2) hours. For the purpose of this Ordinance, recreational vehicles shall include slide-in truck campers, travel trailers, mobile homes, truck campers, tent campers, boat and trailer, snowmobile and trailer, and Landrover. Standard size conversion vans and mini-vans are not included in this prohibition.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave standing on any street, alley, or cartway within the Township any motor vehicle having a registered gross weight in excess of seven thousand (7,000) pounds, or a registered combined gross weight in excess of seven thousand (7,000) pounds provided, however, that such vehicles may be parked temporarily for the purpose of unloading goods, furnishings, merchandise, property or wares used in connection with a resident or business within the Township limits. Said vehicle shall be removed immediately upon the finishing of the unloading of the vehicle which in no event shall exceed a period of twenty-four (24) hours.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave standing any type of non-motorized vehicle or trailer, including, but not limited to, recreational vehicles and truck trailers, upon any street, alley or cartway within the Township, provided, however, that such non-motorized vehicle may be parked temporarily on the Township's streets, alleys and cartways for the purpose of loading and unloading the vehicle, in which case, it may be temporarily parked for a period not to exceed twenty-four (24) hours and provided further that such non-motorized vehicle used in connection with the operation of a business may not be parked for loading or unloading purposes unless such vehicle is parked within one hundred (100) feet of the business that it is servicing.

Section 4. Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction for a violation of this Ordinance, be sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and/or to imprisonment in the Berks County Prison for a period not exceeding ten (10) days, together with costs of prosecution.

Section 5. Each and every violation of any provision of this Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense. The fact that a person has been cited more than one time on any given day shall not relieve the person from complying with the Ordinance for the duration of that day. If after receiving an initial citation, a person refuses to continue to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance, said person may be additionally cited by a law enforcement official for Upper Bern Township until compliance is made. Each failure to comply with this Ordinance shall constitute

a separate and distinct offense for the purposes of imposing fines, penalties and imprisonment.

Section 6. Any provision of any ordinance inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.
